My great-grandfather took part in the Great Patriotic War. He was born on September 6, 1917 in the city of Sokol, Vologda region. After school he entered the mechanical school. Before being drafted into the army, he worked as a tractor driver on a collective farm. In 1935, he was drafted into the army. After serving in the army, he contin-

In September 1942, he was seriously injured. He was hospitalized and sent to Vologda for treatment. After being discharged from the hospital, he was a political Commissar at the Sergeant's school. In 1944, he went to the front again.

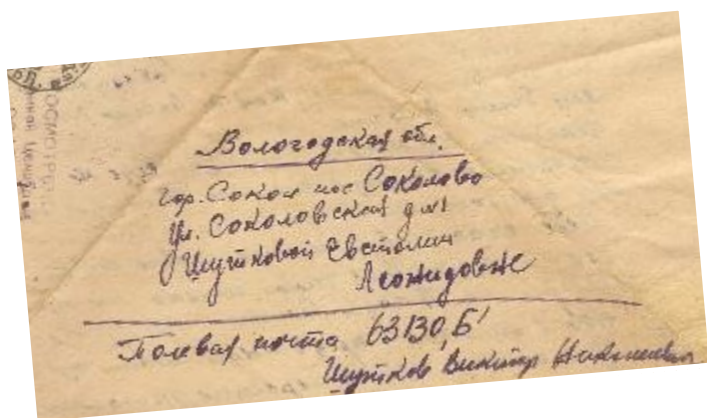
He fought on the Baltic front. He liberated Lithuania, Latvia, and Estonia. For the liberation of the Baltic republics, he was awarded the Order of the Red Star.

After the victory over Germany, he was sent to the Far East. After the end of the war with Japan in 1946, he was sent to a military unit in China. He had been serving there for seven years (until 1953). In China, he married and had a daughter, Tatiana. His son Nicolai (my grandfather) was born in 1954.

In 1955, he went to raise virgin land in Kazakhstan. He worked there as a driver. Then he lectured at schools and clubs.

He was awarded two Orders of the Red Star, the Order of the Great Patriotic War, medals "For the Victory over Germany in the Great Patriotic War of 1941-1945", "For the Victory over Japan", "For Battle Merit", and many commemorative awards.

My family's heroes

Vakhonin Grigoriy Petrovich



During the Great Patriotic War my great-grandfather was a tanker. He began his military journey in Tambov. On the main square of the town the collective farmers handed T-34 tanks over to the soldiers. parade the tank brigade immediately entered the battles.

The tanks were built with the funds raised by the peasants. After the solemn parade the tank brigade immediately entered the battles.

Sergeant Vakhonin Grigory was the gun commander. He had to go through many battle roads. He fought on the Northern Front and was wounded there. After the hospital, he went back to the front.

He participated in the Battle of Stalingrad, crossed the Dnieper river, liberated the city of Dnepropetrovsk, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Germany. My great-grandpa was awarded the Order of the Patriotic War, two medals "For Courage", and the medal "For the Defense of Stalingrad".



After the war, he returned to Sysert and worked at the Sysert bakery.

Lavrova Darya Pavlovna

Our great-grandmother Darya Pavlovna Lavrova was born on July 22, 1921 in the village of Osinovo, Omsk Region.

When the Great Patriotic War began my great-grandmother worked as a combine operator in her native village. In the summer of 1943, she was drafted into the army and began to work at the Omsk 174 Military Plant, located in the city of Omsk.

In April 1944, she together with many builders was sent to Ukraine to restore the city of Yenakiyevo. She worked at a construction site, repairing houses. Then she was sent to the city of Stalino (now Donetsk). She was assigned to the 202

reserve regiment.

In autumn, 1944 my great-grandma was sent to the 331 Lithuanian border regiment. In the city of Kaunas, she studied to be a telephone operator. With her regiment (there were only three girls here), my granny reached Berlin itself.

Due to the outbreak of war with Japan, the regiment was detained in Berlin for several months. Grandmother and her regiment were demobilized only in October 1945.

Our great-grandmother has many medals, including "For the Capture of Berlin" and "For the Victory over Germany".



She died on January 26, 2012. We are proud of our great-grandmother!

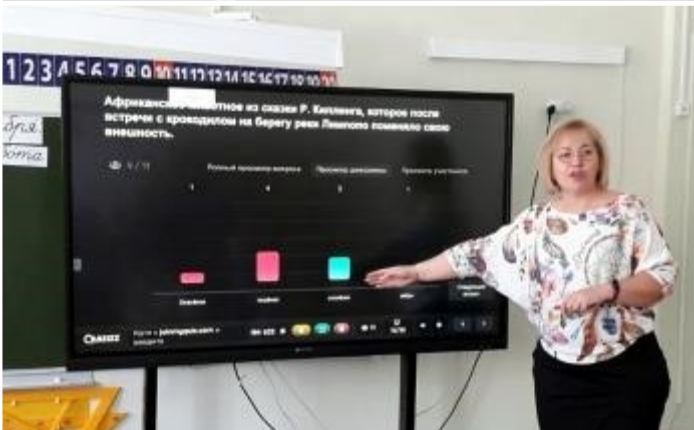
The school library identified the most reading children and noted the most reading classes.

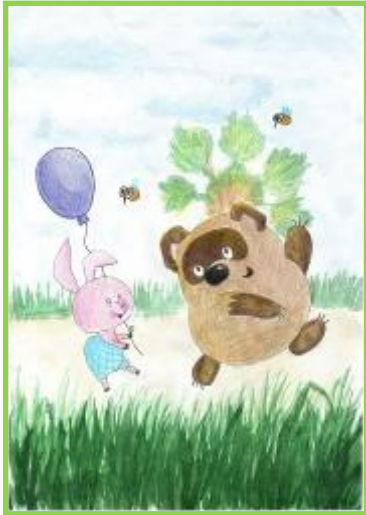

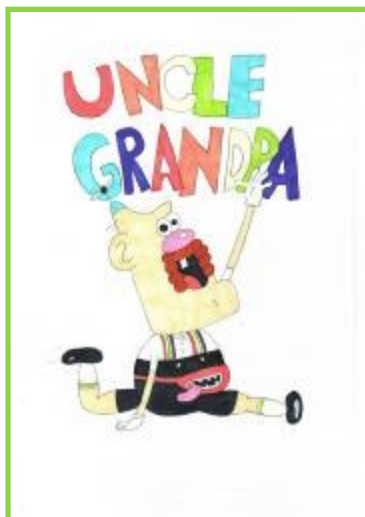

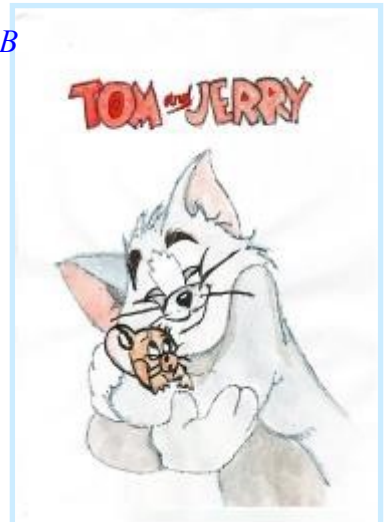

The influence of cartoons on children's cognitive development and behavior

Positive Effects of Watching Cartoons on Children

Helps Kids Learn About Different Things

Watching cartoons is a great way to teach your kids about local customs, traditions, and history.

Helps Children Get an Early Start on Learning

Children often idolize their favourite cartoon character and mimic them or aspire to be like

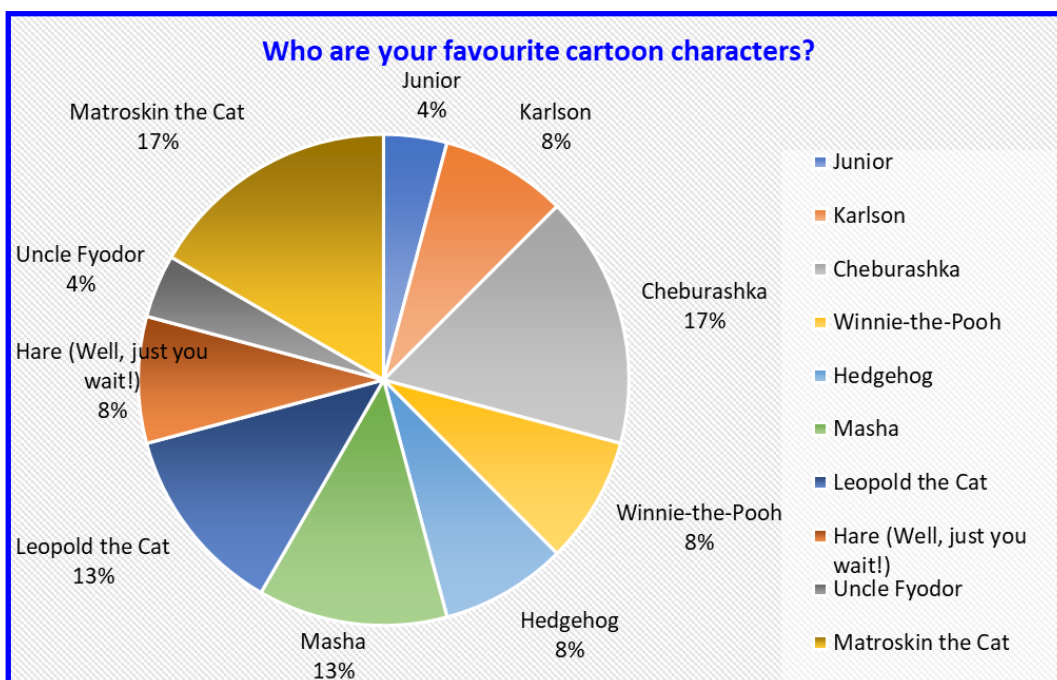
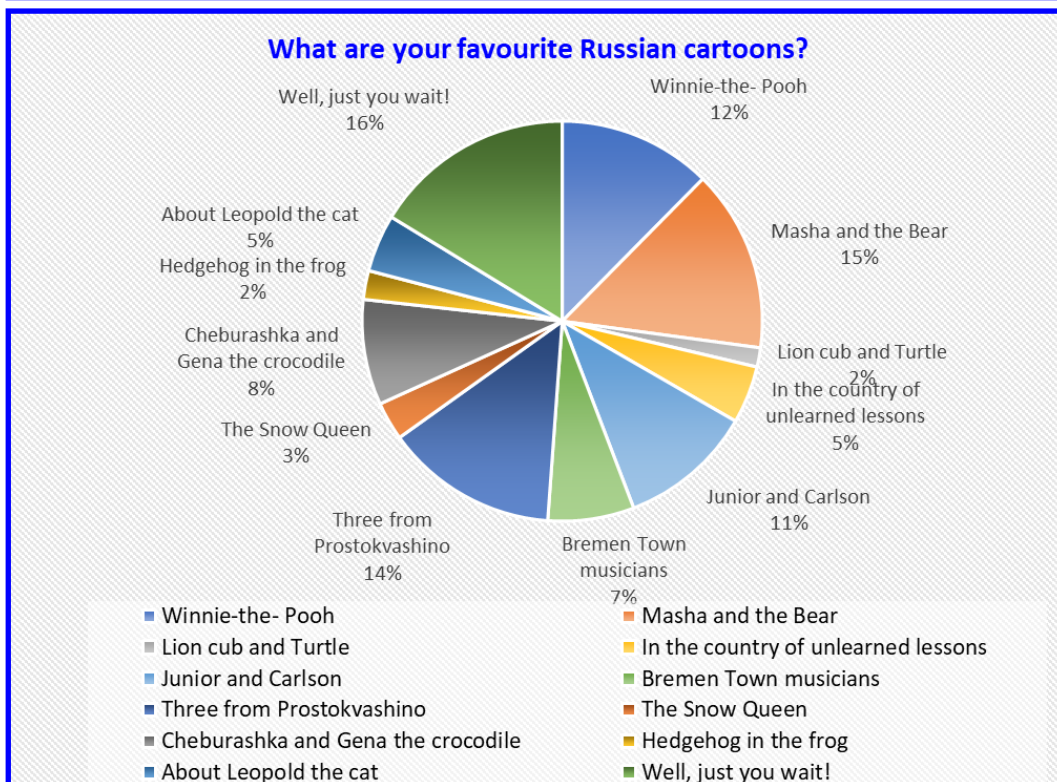
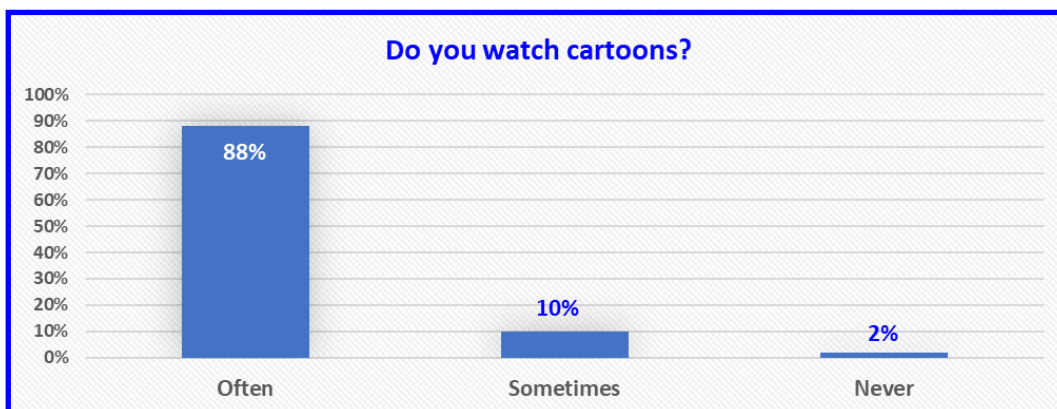
