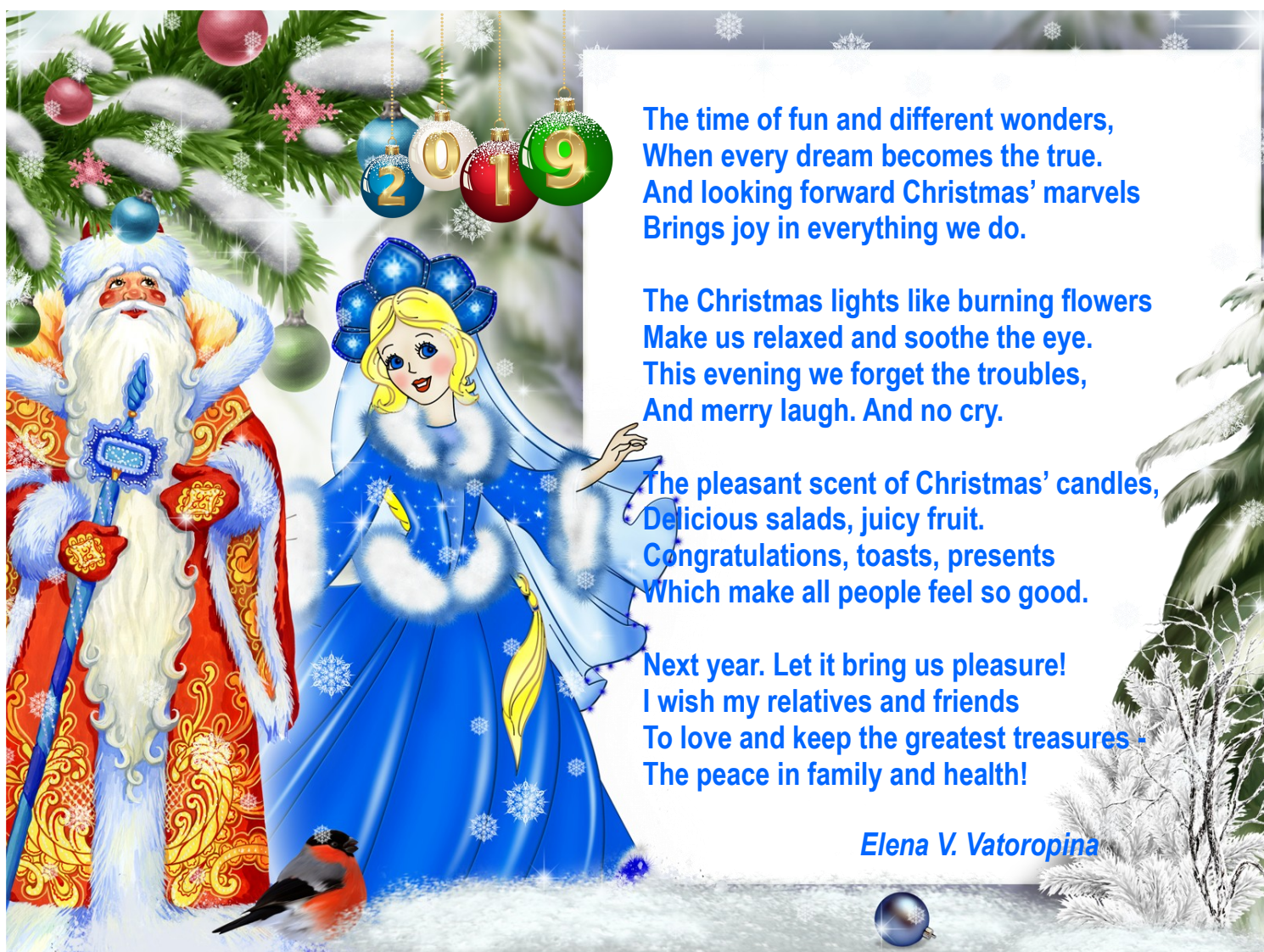

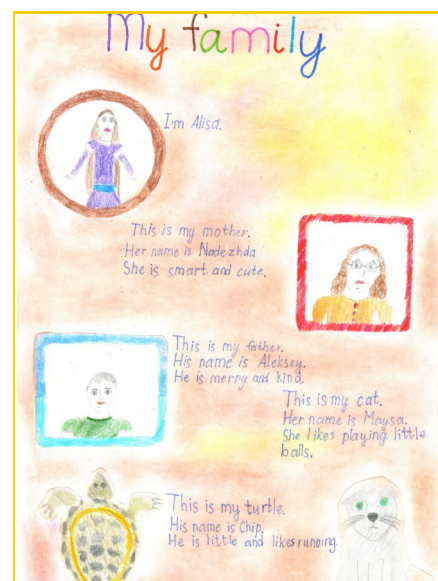

School Chess Tournament

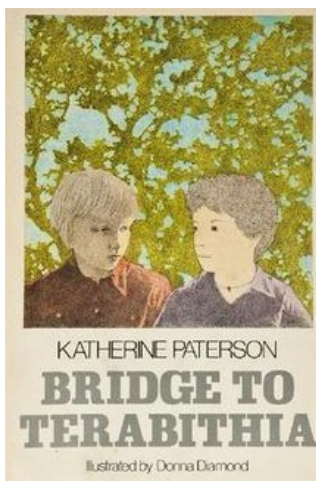

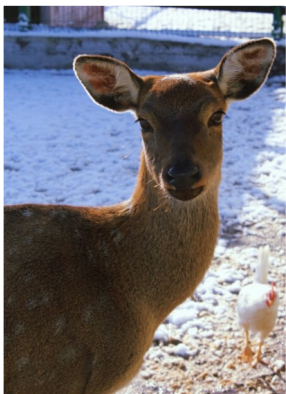
My native land

Some Monuments of Sysert

During my recent visit to Sysert I spent hours exploring the city. I took many pictures of things that interested me. Among these were

Sysert's monuments. I would like to share some of the pictures and what I've learned about the monuments.

Every place I've visited in Russia, from Sloboda to Moscow, has a Great Patriotic War memorial. Sysert's sits in a prominent location on Traktovaya Street. The monument's formal opening was on May 9, 1970 - the 25th anniversary of Victory Day. The statue of a helmeted and caped Soviet soldier holds a plant in its left hand. What kind of plant is it and what does it symbolize? *

Fallen Policemen Monument

Police work can be dangerous, and sometimes deadly. This monument, located in front of the police station, honors those police officers for whom it turned deadly. The statue of a policeman holding a Kalashnikov is reminiscent of the Black Tulip statue in Yekaterinburg. Its sculptor, A. S. Belonosov, is director of the Children's Art School in Sysert. A separate marble slab lists the names of four local officers who died while on duty.



Mistress of Copper Mountain in Tsentralny Park

UGM's 250th anniversary monument is located in a small park in front of the company's management building. Its ancestor, Sysert Ironworks, was founded in 1732 at the base of Bessonova Hill. A dam and blast furnace were built where the Sysert and Black rivers joined, and the area was surrounded with a palisade for protection against the Bashkirs.

* The statue of a soldier holds a plant in its left hand. I don't know exactly what kind of plant it is. Perhaps it is a twig with leaves or carnations. In any case, this plant symbolizes peaceful life and gratefulness to the war heroes. - Elena V. Vatoropina



UGM's 250 Anniversary Monument

There was no city then, just the ironworks' buildings and people. Sysert gradually grew around the factory, and the ironworks eventually evolved into Uralgidromash.

The monument commemorating Sysert native Pavel Petrovich Bazhov is located in Privodskaya Square, below the Church of Simeon the God-Receiver and Anna the Prophetess.

The Soviet sculptor P. A. Sazhin travelled to Sverdlovsk (Yekaterinburg) and met with Bazhov. By the summer of 1947 he had crafted a gypsum bust of the writer. More than thirty years later Sysert asked Sazhin to create a Bazhov monument for the city. The monument, topped with a bronze bust, was finished in 1985 - thirty-five years after Bazhov died.

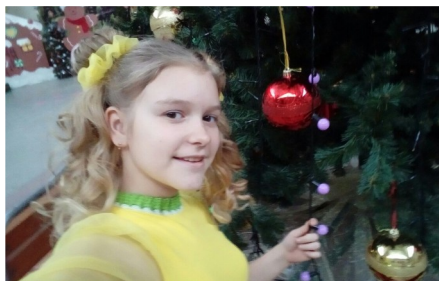

France. The French love to depict the event itself, so these days everywhere you can see scenes of the birth of Christ: with a manger, lambs and little clay dolls "Santons".

United Kingdom. The important event is a solemn speech of the Queen after the Christmas dinner. Before the holiday dinner, the whole family go to church. Children order gifts with the name "Father Christmas".

Germany. The Germans hang wreaths of leaves decorated with candles on the doors of their homes. Many houses have special wooden windows with electric candles, paintings. Near the houses they put models of the nursery in which Jesus Christ was born.

Italy. At the end of the year, the Italians throw old furniture away from the windows. Little

Italians wait for gifts from the woman of Santa Claus, whose name is La Befana.

USA. The USA is a multinational country, so there are different ways of celebrating Christmas. Kids get presents in the morning because Santa Claus comes at night. He goes down through the chimney and brings gifts.

Finland. Lapland is officially declared the Land of Santa Claus. Santa Claus lives here, and his name is Finnish Yulupukki. Any resident of the Earth sends him a letter. His address is: Finland, 96930, Arctic Circle.

Sweden. In Sweden, Christmas lasts the whole month: from December 13 to January 13. Everyone waits for gifts from the Christmas gnome who lives in the dungeons of every Swedish house.

China. The Chinese decorate "Trees of Light" - analogs of the Christmas trees - with exquisite lanterns, flowers and garlands. Children wait for their gifts on hangers in stockings on the walls, which Dun Che Lao Ren (Grandfather Christmas) brings them.

Japan. In Japan, the main figure of the holiday is the god Hoteyosho. At Christmas, the Japanese put bundles of straw on high pillars near their houses and set them on fire to scare evil spirits away.

Russia. On Christmas morning, the whole family are supposed to attend the church. During the day, it is necessary to cook kutya (oatmeal) so that during lunch the host could open a door or a window and "invite" frost to try to soothe him.

THE NATIONAL EISTEDDFOD OF WALES



Eisteddfod, or the National Eisteddfod of Wales, is one of the biggest festivals in the world, which each time takes place at a new venue, advertised for 2-3 years. It is

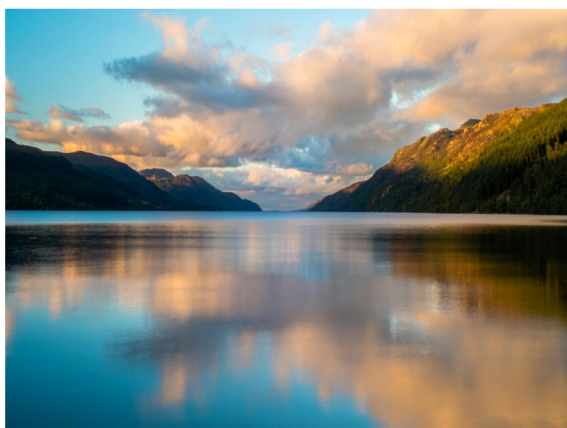
believed that the festival dates back to 1176, when Lord Rees up Griffith organized a tournament of poets and musicians in his castle Cardigan. Eisteddfod gradually turned into a big folk festival. After the decline it was revived and since 1880 it is held almost every year.

In addition to the competition, there are a lot of other interesting events at the fes-

tival: there are pavilions of literature, science and technology, a theater, a dance hall, a live music pavilion, a "teacher's" pavilion for students and teachers of the Welsh language. Thousands of shopping and souvenir stalls are organized at the festival, and a variety of national food is offered. The event lasts a week, many guests all this time living in tents on its territory. A total of 150 thousand guests visit Eisteddfod annually.

The Welsh Language



Wales is a part of Great Britain. What language do the Welsh speak? The Welsh themselves call their language cymraeg. About 0.9 million people speak this language. Most of them are bilingual. Welsh belongs to the British branch of the Celtic languages. The language has been improving for a long time. Welsh in the 12th century was very different from Welsh in our time. Language splits into 4 dialects: vinetsky (North-West), Poissy (North-Eastern, Central),

diversi (South-West) and gonski (South-East). They differ only in pronunciation. Most often, the Welsh speak a Papuan language.

Here are some examples: море - sea - mor; рождество - Christmas - Nadolig; маленький - little - bach.

It is interesting to know that all consonants in the Welsh language are read as in Russian. The letter "y" is read by the Welsh as "e", and the letter "w" is a vowel and read as "u".
