

that attract people's attention to their hobby.



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#### **DANO** hackaton

In September, a hackathon organized by UrFU, HSE and T-Bank took place at the Ural Federal University as part of the DANO Data Analysis Olympiad. The event brought together talented schoolchildren from several regions of Russia. 16 teams took part in the two-day hackathon. The participants worked with the Casco insurance database, developed and tested hypotheses that could improve risk

Along with technical skills, the hackathon also emphasized the importance of effective communication and presentation skills. The teams presented their solutions to a jury of experts who evaluated not only the technical execution, but also the clarity and persuasiveness of our presentations. This opportunity pre-



pared us for a better presentation of our research, and after the defense, we received feedback from experts, where the weaknesses and strengths of our research were analyzed.

Also, in addition to the hackathon itself, a meme contest was held, which was also conducted with the help of experienced juries, and gave our team a great

time during these 2 days. According to the results of the competition, our team took the first place for the best and funniest meme among all the teams.

In general, the DANO hackathon on data analysis at UrFU was an invalua-



ble experience that significantly ex-

panded our knowledge in the field of

data analysis. We learned in practice

how to analyze the dataset, build a

hypothesis, derive its mechanism, conduct mathematical analysis. Events like this play a crucial role in the development of the data analytics industry. Saint Petersburg is the northern capital of Russia, founded more than 300 years ago by Peter the Great. People come here to get acquainted with the history and architecture of the XVIII-XX centuries, to walk along river canals and drawbridges. State Hermitage Museum was founded in 1764 when **Empress** Catherine the Great acquired a collection of paintings from the Berlin merchant Johann Ernst The Gotzkowsky. collection museum's contains about 3.2 million exhibits, including masterpieces of Ancient Greece and Rome, Western Europe, Central Asia and Russia, modern art, rare books, porcelain, coins and weapons.

The modern appearance of Peterhof Palace's ensemble formed was during one and a half centuries. Initially, plans of Peterhof founder Peter I were realized by I. Braunstein, J. Leblond and N. Michetti. During the life first Russian of the emperor, there was only a two-story building here, called the Nagornye Palaty, which was used for celebrations and receptions.





Today, the majestic palace in Peterhof, bearing the imprint of several artistic and architectural styles, invites guests to immerse themselves in the exquisite world of palace luxury of the House of Romanov.




We traveled much around Lake Baikal. One of the most beautiful excursions we had was to Peschanaya Bay.

Lake Baikal is in a rift valley, created by the Baikal Rift Zone, where the Earth's crust is slowly pulling apart. At 636 km long and 79 km wide, Lake Baikal has the largest surface area of any freshwater lake in Asia, at 31,722 km², and is the deepest lake in the world at 1,642 metres.

#### The Taltsy Museum:

Immerse yourself in Siberian culture







Architecturalethnographic Museum «Taltsy» is a unique collection of monuments of history, architecture and ethnography of XVII-XX centuries. The Museum complex under the open sky attracts visitors with opportunity for direct experience of material spiritual culture of the peoples of the Baikal region.

Taltsy is located at a picturesque site among the forests midway between the Siberian city of Irkutsk and the village of Listvyanka, on the southwest shore of sacred Lake Baikal.

Among the more rare monuments, is the Tower of the Saviour built in 1667 and the Kazanskaya chapel of former Ilimsk built fortress between 1667 and

1679. Both of these monuments were built over 300 years ago without any nails. They were transferred to the Museum's location from the flooded areas of the Ust-Ilimskaya.











### **Teacher's comments**

# Teaching and upbringing in English lessons and extracurricular activities

The formation of a harmoniously developed personality is both a need and the main goal of modern education. The school plays an important role in this process. A.S. Makarenko wrote: "Students are educated by everything: people, things, phenomena, but above all and for the longest time — people. Parents and teachers are in the first place."

The signs of a well-rounded personality are education, well-mannered and general development. Accordingly, the learning process should carry out three functions — educational, upbringing, and developmental.

The educational function of learning consists in the assimilation of knowledge, the formation of special and general academic skills and abilities.

It is impossible to reduce teaching a foreign language only to mastering students' lexical and grammatical competence, phonetic skills and conversational skills. It is necessary to study the culture, history, and peculiarities of the state structure of foreign countries and our homeland. This contributes to the forof students' mation sociocultural and communicative competencies.

The following important trends in teaching a foreign language are also observed in modern schools: a differentiated and multi-level approach; the use of innovative technologies; increasing and updating educational information; a systemactivity approach to learning, etc.

The learning process also performs an upbringing function, which contributes to the formation of certain views, beliefs, personal qualities, value orientations, goals and ways of behavior and activity in society among schoolchildren. The upbringing function of learning gives the learning process a certain purposefulness and social significance, contributes to the formation of a well-rounded.

socially active personality in the context of universal culture.

The development function does not exist independently, but is a consequence of the educational and upbringing functions of learning.



The intensity, versatility, breadth and depth of development depend on how education and upbringing will be implemented.

English lessons, as well as other subjects of the humanities. solve various educational tasks: the formation of healthy social relations, patriotic education, environmental care, education of moral and ethical standards. The teacher not only transmits a certain set of knowledge and skills to the students, but through his studies contributes to the development and upbringing of the child's personality. The topics students discuss during the lessons and extracurricular activities ("Friendship", "My family", "Environmental problems", "My Homeland", "The World of the Future", Russians". "Famous "Professions", etc.) have a very important upbringing aspect.

It is safe to say that teaching English and educating schoolchildren is more successful when students are involved in project-research and creative activities.

# Развивающие игры и упражнения для первоклассников: советы педагога-психолога

Педагог-психолог нашей школы Елена Сергеевна Леонова подобрала комплекс игр и упражнений, которые помогут в обучении первоклассникам, да и всем ученикам, которые хотят учиться лучше.



В этом учебном году наша школа от-крыла двери для многих перво-классников. Обучение в первом классе — непростой период для

ребёнка, когда он сталкивается с новым коллективом, первым учителем, начинает познавать школьные предметы. На начальных этапах необходимо научиться быть мобильным, грамотно выполнять все задания и рекомендации учителя, и, конечно же, конструктивно общаться со своими одноклассниками. Ребятам, у которых отлично развита быстрота реакции, мышление, память, внимание, моторика, связная речь, эмоционально-волевая сфера, естественно, обучение в школе будет даваться легко, просто и в удовольствие.

В первую очередь, следует использовать разнообразные игры на закрепление знаний о форме, цвете предметов, установление определённой последовательности, собирание по схеме и пр. Данные упражнения учат ребёнка выполнять задание по определённой закономерности, что необходимо на уроках, развивают мел-

кую моторику рук, логическое мышление. Можно ипользовать игры и дидактические пособия, типа: «Танграм», «Палочки Кюинезера», «Пальцы вверх», «Кубики Никитина» и др.

Очень, конечно же, важно, чтобы у ребёнка в первом классе была хороша развита мелкая моторика пальцев, которая необходима для навыка письма. Первыми помощниками в этом будут упражнения лепки, рисования, вырезания ножницами. Дополнительно можно использовать разнообразные упражнения на шнуровку, собирание пазлов, конструктора Lego с мелкими деталями.

Современным детям будут интересны игры и упражнения с японскими палочками «Mokuru». С обеих концов бочонок «Мокуру» снабжён резиновыми наконечниками, которые обеспечивают прекрасную амортизацию неваляшки. То есть задача состоит в том, чтобы толкнуть палочку с таким ускорением, что бы они перевернулась на 180 / 360 и более градусов и остановить палочку ладонью, когда она встанет на резиновый наконечник. Данные палочки помогают развивать внимательность, быстроту реакции, учат ребёнка управлять своими движениями, расчитывать силу. Самое главное, что данные палочки гармонизируют работу обоих полушарий мозга, так как выполнять упражнения можно правой и левой рукой.

Один из необходимых навыков, который необходим для первоклассника – это умение управлять

своими эмоциями, сдерживать негатив. Большую роль в этом сыграют игры с песком, игры на световых столах. Ребёнок, в процессе игр с песком, очень успокаивается, по-

гружается В свой внутренний мир, снимается внутреннее напряжение. O<sub>T</sub>личная память залог успешной учёбы. Повысить уровень



запоминания у ребёнка помогут игры «МЕМО», которых в настоящее время представлено большое разнообразие темам ПО «Достопримеча-(«Животные», тельности России», «Транспорт», пр.). «Космос» И Играя «МЕМО», можно развить свою память и расширить знания об окружающем мире.

Немаловажный навык в обучении школе — умение конструктивно общаться, договариваться, высказывать свою точку зрения. В этом ребёнку могут помочь игры в команде, различные словесные игры («Крокодил», «Пойми меня», «Ответь за 10 секунд» и пр.), викторины. Такие игры можно организовать в семье, в классе, во время прогулок.

Быть учеником первого классанепросто, малейшие достижения для ребёнка- очень важны, поэтому родители и педагоги должны сразу мотивировать ребёнка, отмечать заслуги, чтобы впереди его сопутствовали только успех, удача и отличные оценки!

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
