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

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Our fellow countrymen, heroes of the Great Patriotic War

A legendary scout Nikolai Kuznetsov



Nicolai Ivanovich Kuznetsov was born in February 27, 1911 in the village of Zyryanka, Perm province. In 1926, he graduated from the seven-year school and entered the agronomical department of the Tyu-Agricultural Technical School, but then, due to the death of his father, was forced

to return to the village.

In 1927, he recovered at the Talitsky Forestry College, during his studies he began to learn German independently and mastered it at a free level. Kuznetsov learned not only the literary German language, but also six dialects of the German language, Polish and Ukrainian, Esperanto and Komi-Perm language.

In 1934, he got a job in Sverdlovsk – first as a statistician, then as a draftsman, and in 1935 – as an engineer for the design office at Uralmashzavod.

Since 1938, Kuznetsov began to perform special tasks in the diplomatic environment of Moscow. He worked with foreign diplomats, recruited many of them, and participated in the interception of diplomatic mail.

During the war, Kuznetsov was to pose as a Nazi officer, infiltrate the occupying forces on the Ukraine territory and methodically and mercilessly kill high-ranking Nazi officials.

Disguised as German Oberleutnant Paul Siebert, the Soviet spy approached his risky mission with utmost dedication. In the 16 months of work, Kuznetsov assassinated 11 Nazi generals and high-ranking officials in occupied Ukraine.

The legendary Soviet spy was killed in March 1944, when he tried fleeing occupied Ukraine and joining partisans. His fate was unknown to the Soviet authorities up until 1959, when a Soviet search team discovered Kuznetsov's alleged remains. Posthumously, Nikolai Kuznetsov was awarded the title of Hero of the Soviet Union.

In Russia, the memory of the outstanding Soviet intelligence officer is preserved to this day. There are many objects, named after Nikolai Kuznetsov.

A Soviet fighter pilot **Grigory Rechkalov**

Grigory Andreevich Rechkalov was born on February 9, 1920, in the village of Khudyakovo, Perm region into a peasant family.

In 1929, Grisha's family moved to the village of Bobrovskoye near Sverdlovsk. In the school of the neighboring village of Bolshoy Istok, he got a seven-year education and entered a factory school in Sverdlovsk. In 1935, he



began his career working as an electrician, first at a factory in Verh-Isetskoye, and then at a flour mill power plant in the city of Aramil, near Sverdlovsk. In 1938, he joined the Army. In 1939, Rechkalov

graduated from Perm Military Aviation Pilot School. He was initially grounded because of Daltonism, but due to the start of the war he was allowed to fly in 1941 and posted to the 55th Fighter Aviation Regiment, stationed in the Odessa Military District. Grigory Rechkalov was a Soviet fighter pilot scored over fifty solo shootdowns, making him one of the highest

scoring Soviet fighter pilots. He was twice awarded the title Hero of the Soviet Union and many medals and orders for his aerial victo-

He wrote two books about his wartime experience. Grigory Andreevich Rechkalov was buried in the village of Bobrovsky, near the graves of relatives.



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APRIL, 12 - COSMONAUTICS DAY

First man in space: Yuri Gagarin



Riding a tide of successes in space, the Soviet Union set out to achieve the next

logical accomplishment: putting a man into orbit. On April 12, 1961, cosmonaut Yuri

Gagarin circled Earth one time in a Vostok spacecraft before ejecting 23,000 feet above the planet and parachuting safely down. Gagarin's flight was the shortest manned mission in space history, lasting just 108 minutes from takeoff to touchdown. After the flight, Gagarin achieved celebrity status and toured the world extensively to promote the Soviet space program.

First woman in space: Valentina Tereshkova



After the success of Yuri Gagarin's spaceflight in 1961, the Soviet Union immediately turned to the

idea of putting a woman in space. They marshaled a female cosmonaut corps that underwent extensive training, and on June 16,

1963, Valentina Tereshkova lifted off in Vostok 6 for three days of Earth orbits. In order to fly as a cosmonaut, Tereshkova had to be a member of the Soviet Air Force, so she was honorarily inducted prior to liftoff. During her spaceflight, Tereshkova performed experiments that tested the effects of weightlessness on the female body and also took photographs that helped scientists identify an aerosol layer in Earth's atmosphere.

First spacewalk: Alexei Leonov

In order to break the bonds of encapsulated space flight, the Soviet space program developed the first pressurized spacesuit and created the first multiperson spacecraft, dubbed the Voskhod. The Voskhod 1 mission took a trio of cosmonauts into space in October 1964. On March 18, 1965, Alexei Leonov became the first person to free-float in space. Leonov said he felt "like a seagull with its wings outstretched, soaring high above the Earth."

Vladislav A. Kostin, a teacher of additional education at the Center for Children's Technical Creativity, head of ship modeling and aircraft modeling circles.






Natalia E. Andreeva, a teacher in several generations, the founder and teacher of the LAD intellectual Development Center of Sysert.
















April is a traditional time to make our streets and yards clean.





It is very important to show children examples of friendship, truthfulness, responsiveness, resourcefulness, and courage. To implement its tasks, the puppet theater has great opportunities.

Due to the visual and imaginative thinking of younger schoolchildren, puppet theatre helps the child understand the content of a literary work easier, brighter and more correctly, affects the development of his artistic taste.

According to Larisa Afonasievna, puppet theatre is the form of dramatization which is most appropriate to the age of younger school children. **Emotional** feelings, child's activity and involvement into the creative process enrich the child's experience. Special attention to play activities within drama allows teacher to make the process of entering a child into the world of culture fascinating and adequate to the age peculiarities of vounger school dents.

In teaching, Elena Vladimirovna makes extensive use of creative tasks, playing various musical instruments, multimedia presentations, and video materials.

Nowadays, the use of information and computer technology in the music lessons is very important and effective. It is difficult for children and adolescents to overestimate the potential of information technology as a means of artistic expression and learning, aesthetic development, and art education.

The availability and diversity of all computer technologies (three-dimensional, animation, video, audio, imitation of traditional visual techniques, interactivity, hypertext) allows the computer to create creativity and self-education for students and teachers allows for an open learning and development environment.

The use of computer programs allows for more effective development of all types of cognition and the use of all types of memory throughout the lesson: visual, auditory, motor, figurative, associative.

The constant change of activities in the lesson does not allow children to get bored and tired of monotonous tasks. The students work with interest. which helps to preserve their health.









For music lessons to be interesting and engaging for students, several positions need to be considered: interdisciplinary and interdisciplinary relationships, the

logic of the learning process, the age characteristics of the students, the cultural level of the students, as well as the teacher's ex-

cellent knowledge of the subject and computer technology.

Elena Vladimirovna conducts extensive work with students during the lessons and extracurricular activities. The teacher considers extracurricular activities
